From the Dean's Desk

LET THERE BE GROWTH AND DEPTH IN OUR LITURGICAL SPIRITUALITY FOR THE YEAR 2012

WE NEED TO PARTICIPATE IN WHAT CHRIST OFFERS

"For once you were darkness but now you are light in the Lord; walk as children of light."

As children of God, made so through Baptism, we are called by God to participate in the salvific work of God. But we must begin by accepting the 'truth' that we are who we are- disciples of Jesus Christ. And who is a disciple? He/ she is one "who listens to the master, who learns from the master, and who seeks in every way to be like the master."

We need to identify ourselves with these words: "So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God. Giving thanks to Father who has qualified us to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. He has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and transferred us to the Kingdom of His beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins." (**Colossians 1:12-14**)

From time to time, I seek to carry the readers back to 'writings' in the bulletin. I do so in order to have continuity of thought on the theme and topic. On 8th January it was mentioned- "As we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord, we think of the power of light poured into us that drives out the darkness. The Creation Story ought to come to us- 'Let there be light'." And it goes on to say, "we are to recognize our calling as disciples and to carry the light of the Gospel into the world, spreading the light of Christ". The bulletin continues- "It is in this season we are called to focus on the themes of light, discipleship, baptism and the mission of the Church. Follow the liturgical headlines and begin by looking for the early events of Jesus' life and min-

istry.”

In the Gospel according to St. John, the writer uses the motif of “light and life” and reveals that Christ offers us “light and life” Christ is here to help us discern and discover the light from the darkness. The cry is: ‘God come for your world’ because all around us seems to be darkness, violence, immorality, corruption, destruction and death. But, as Christ’s disciples, we are reminded of the travelling light. “Take (receive) this light and walk (travel) as a child of light. The baptism liturgy says: “God has rescued us from the power of darkness and brought us into the Kingdom of His beloved Son. Receive this light and walk as a child of light” (BCP p. 279).

In the Easter Vigil we read: “May the light of Christ, rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds” (BCP p. 255). It is on that same night of the Easter Vigil that we pray to the Almighty God,” the Creator of the universe, Source of all light that we may live forever in the radiance of His glory” (BCP p. 261). “....Grant that all who are born again in baptism may show forth in their lives what they profess by their faith” (BCP p.261). And the ‘Collect for the Day’ prays: “Eternal Giver of life and light, this holy night shines with radiance of the risen Christ. Renew your Church with the Spirit given to us in Baptism, that we may worship you in sincerity and truth, and shine as a light in the world.....” (BCP p. 262)

What is it that Jesus asks us to do? Just “follow me.” If we are concerned about our discipleship, then the answer to our concern is to share in the faith of Jesus. We should show that Jesus is the only way to God. And He is the true light that lights everyone who comes to him.
