From the Dean's Desk

HARVEST THANKSGIVING

'Harvest' speaks to us about the 'gathering of the crops'

It is important for us to note that Christianity has its evolution from Judaism. And

that many things that form the base of the Christian 'Faith and Practice' have their roots in Judaism. Faithful Jews recall God's work in Creation and His sustaining power; His work of salvation and His continued blessing and journey with His people. Significantly, they acknowledged that whatever they come to harvest has to do with the Sole Creator of the world.

The core of the Jewish life is revealed in acts of 'praise and thanksgiving.' Constantly, they 'recall' God's goodness to them. It ought to be the same for us as God's people of the New Covenant. That is why, for us Anglicans, the focus of worship is "The Holy Eucharist"- 'The Act of Thanksgiving' for what God in Christ has done for us through the Cross, Resurrection and Ascension.

History ought to be a living tradition for all of us- recalling and retelling the story of our life. For, according to the history of the people of Israel, when the Harvest Seasons were celebrated, at different times according to the crops, they brought the **first** and the **best** to God. Their faith and practice was not based on "an abstract philosophical understanding of God." It was the **acting out** of the story of the goodness of God. They revealed it in their lives of worship through '**Festivals and Thanksgiving.**' Therefore, we must continue to reveal to the world that God is the Provider and Sustainer of life. And as the hymn says and we sing #725 CPWI hymnal:

We plough the fields, and scatter
the good seed on the land,
but it is fed and watered
by God's almighty hand;
He sends the snow in winter,
the warmth to swell the grain,
the breezes and the sunshine,
and soft refreshing rain.

Refrain: All good gifts around us
are sent from heaven above,
then thank the Lord, O thank the Lord,
For all his love.
