From the Bishop's Desk

The recent acts of violence and the incident on Tuesday 13th September, 2011 in Campden Park, in which a man killed his wife and another female and shot two men who are being treated at the Milton Cato Memorial Hospital, has evoked a sense of awe and horror. For the death of a human being is not something we fully understand nor easily accept, much more the gruesome harming and killing of these persons.

As Christians we cannot condone such acts of violence in our society, and we must empathize with those who have lost their loved ones, in addition we are to pray for them, those who have died and for the perpetrators.

We must never accept violence as a solution to domestic conflict or conflict of any sort. The questions are: how do we console and give hope to the victim's family/relatives? And what may have led those individuals to misuse their freedom and make such a wrong choice? As a Church we continue to grapple with, and seek to find ways and means to respond to such situations. The Provincial Year of the Family and the Worldwide Mother's Union Parenting Programme are geared towards this. Let us see these as ongoing initiatives, and seek to develop and be involved in long term activities and programmes which assist people to address and resolve the various issues and circumstances in their lives, which may cause them to experience trauma, shock, a sense of hopelessness, and that which may lead them to misuse their freedom and make wrong choices. In parishes where such ministries are already in place I encourage you to continue and to share your experience and knowledge with others.

May God give us the grace to face and respond to the challenges of ministry in this place, our efforts at times, may seem useless and daunting, but we must never lose heart.

On Behalf of the Diocese of the Windward Islands I extend our condolences to the families, friends and relatives of those who were killed, and pray for the persons who are still nursing injuries. Rest eternal Grant unto those who have died, O Lord, and May light perpetual shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.
