Bishop's Retreat

Revelation: Turning Hell into Heaven. The Theme of the retreat invited the Bishops of the CPWI to reflect on the arduous journey of the episcopate through the Revelation of John. The goal was the same as John, seeking the Tree of Life that heals us all-individually, community and globally. The Conductor –The Very Rev'd Michael Battle, Ph.D and was held at Our Lady of Florida Spiritual Centre, Florida.

The retreat was quite enlightening, intellectually stimulating, and spiritually uplifting. It helped me to put several things into perspective, including my own journey as bishop of this diocese, and to create in me a deeper sense of interest in the book of Revelation.

Mother's Union Worldwide Parenting Programmed

In the archdeaconry of St. Vincent & the Grenadines the facilitators and their support persons will be commissioned at 3:00pm on Sunday 25th September, 2011 at the St. Matthew's Parish Church, Biabou.

Here is an update on the Mothers' Union Worldwide Parenting Programme. In the archdeaconry of St. Vincent and The Grenadines Submitted by Mrs. Lois Friday Coordinator.

A meeting was held on Saturday 27th August, 2011, at the Bishop's Court, New Montrose to go through our approach to delivering the sessions concentrating on the first two chapters of the manual. The facilitators continue to display keen commitment to that ministry and this is truly heartening. Facilitators were already provided with application forms and are now in the process of enlisting participants to the programme. We expect groups to have a minimum of 8 persons, maximum 12. Being our first group we may wish to start with the smaller number that is, 8 persons. We are looking at starting around the third week of September and the programme is expected to run for 9-12 weeks. There are some material/equipment needed to begin and we are trying to source these from our congregations and groups in the Church. We have prepared a list of these and the associated/estimated costs. These include flip chart/white board with stand/lap top and projector, one of the three depending on the facilitator's choice of delivery. The list also includes notebooks, pens, pencils, markers and glue. There is also the need for snacks to be provided for participants following each session and we are looking for persons to volunteer these.

While we are preparing a proposal seeking funding for the delivery of the project and training of another batch of facilitators we will still need assistance in the interim to take the programme off the ground.

Two support persons attended the meeting on Saturday. We plan to have a meeting with all support persons prior to the start of the sessions with the course participants. We also hope to have the commissioning of facilitators and the blessing of supports and participants at a service prior to our starting the sessions.

We therefore ask that you continue to keep us in your prayers.
